
## **NASCOE Behind the Scenes**


As you are reading this, final preparations are happening for the National Convention July 31st through August 3rd in Manhattan, Kansas. KASCOE has prepared a great convention for us and I am looking forward to seeing everyone there. We anticipate good representation from the National Office even with the high demands on their time with farm bill implementation.

It has been a busy spring with state conventions and area rallies. NASCOE appreciates the National Office making sure that there were representatives at the area rallies. The opportunity to engage with senior leadership is always welcomed and an important part of the national conventions and area rallies.

A highlight of the Northeast Area Rally was news from the National Office that DD's and other members of state leadership teams will be receiving licenses to access the Optimally Productive Office (OPO) and the Staffing Model (SM) software. They have been instructed to share the workload information with the counties within their district. Local managers will only receive information that pertains to the counties they administer.

NASCOE is currently working on several items including a second Leadership Development Conference, a membership video, staffing and hiring issues. appropriations, performance plans,
