LEGISLATIVE REPORT

There hasn't been a lot happening on the legislative front lately, so I'll keep this short and sweet. As most of you probably know by now, the American Rescue Plan included special COVID leave provisions for federal employees. There are several articles available online with specifics if you are interested in utilizing leave under this provision.

As some of you may have read in the NASCOE Legislative Committee Update from the end of March, FSA secured another increase in funding for salaries and expenses for FY 2021. Staffing continues to be at the forefront of

conversations with both management the 2021 TASCOE Convention. and legislators, and these conversations will be ongoing as future budgets are established. We all feel the pain of being tasked with "doing more with less" but it is critical to keep our county offices staffed if we are expected to maintain the level of service we strive to provide.

While no details have been nailed down at this point, there are discussions about another NASCOE Leadership Training event to be held in Kansas City in October. Stay tuned for more information. These events are a great way to learn more about NASCOE and how members can get more involved in the work of our Association.
