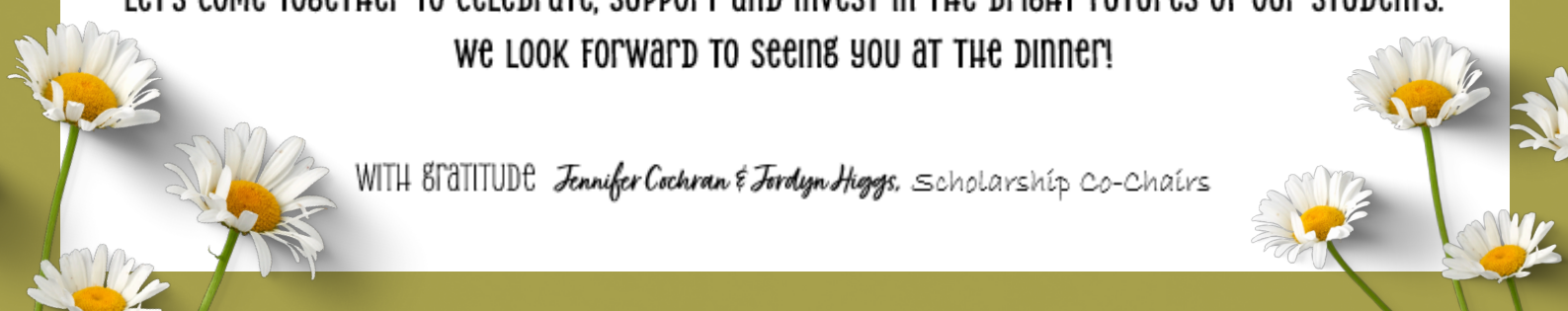

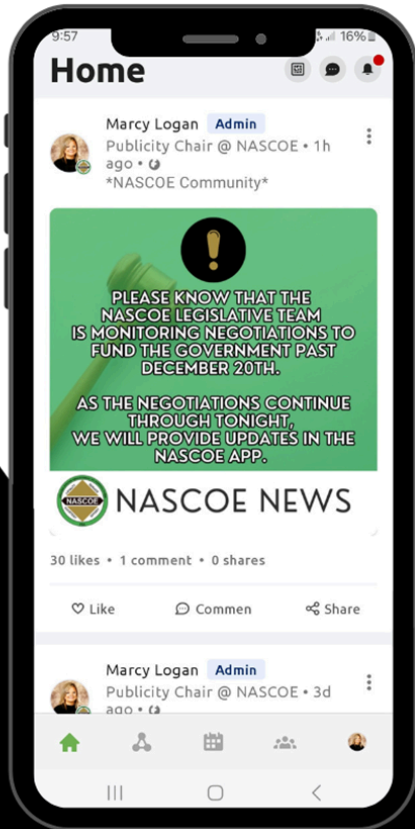

This solves 99% of app issues. If you're having trouble seeing posts now but you've seen posts before, try this step first before moving on to the next tip.

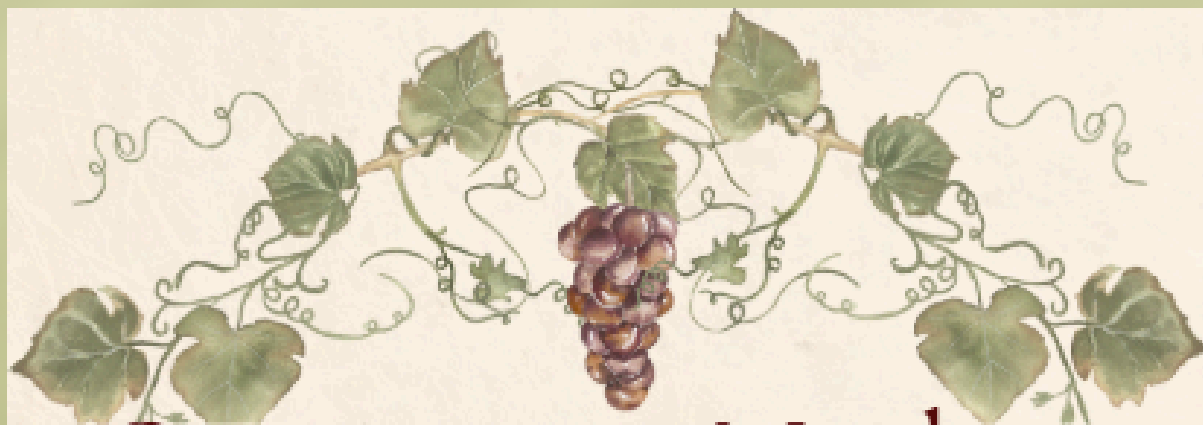
Check for App Updates

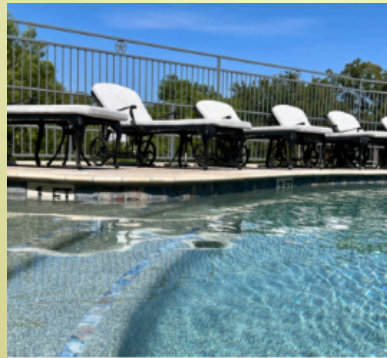

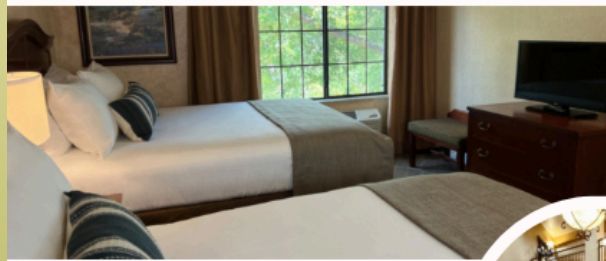

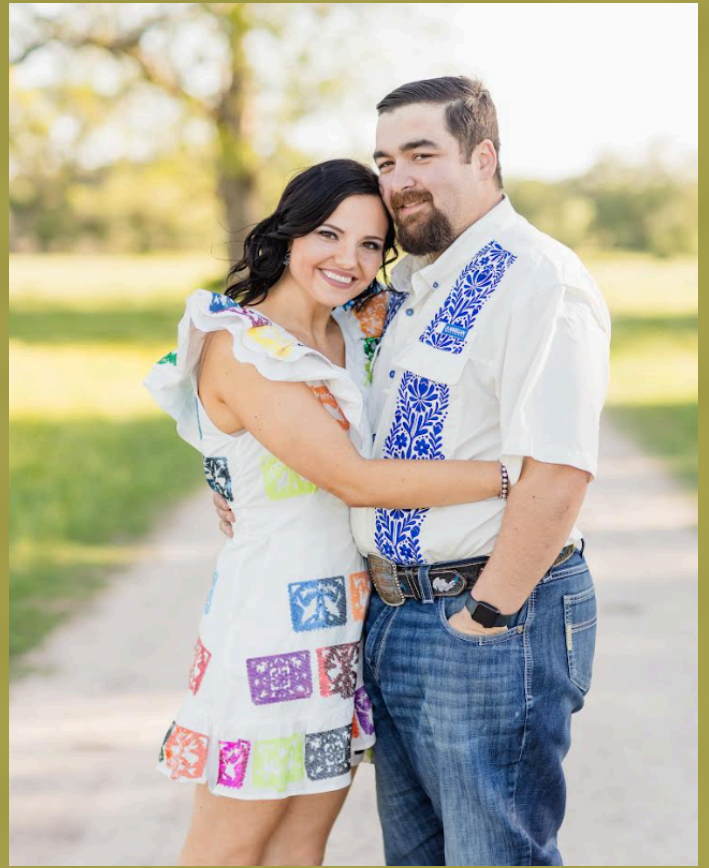
KIMBLE-EDWARDS-KERR AND BANDERA COUNTIES

Dallas County CED Stefen Tucker's softball team placed 3rd at a national tournament in Minneapolis, MN!

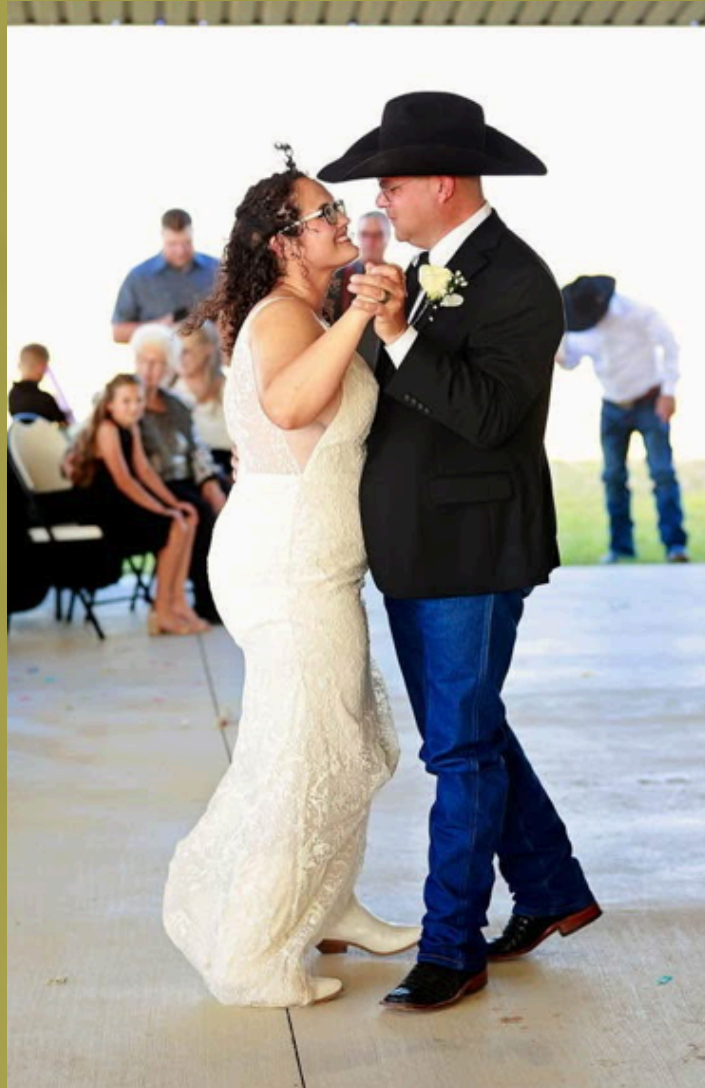


MONTAGUE COUNTY

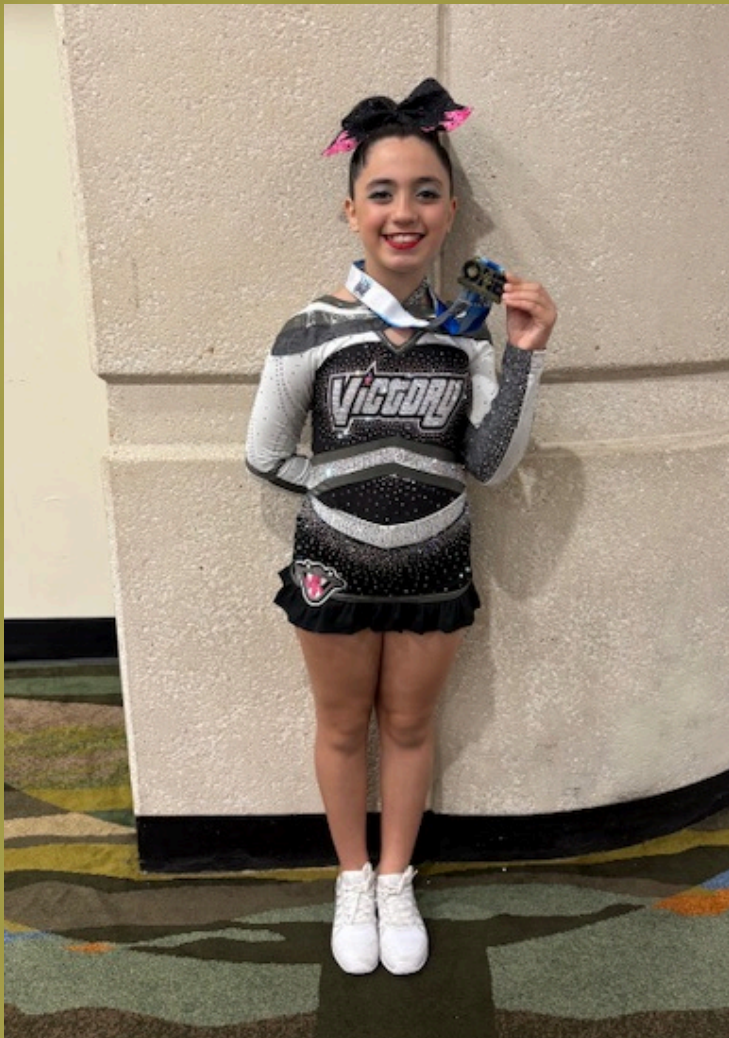
DISTRICT 15

Rene and Pete Ramos, PA Jim Wells/Brooks-Jim Hogg- as Pete said “How can he leave? We’re like Batman and Robin!”



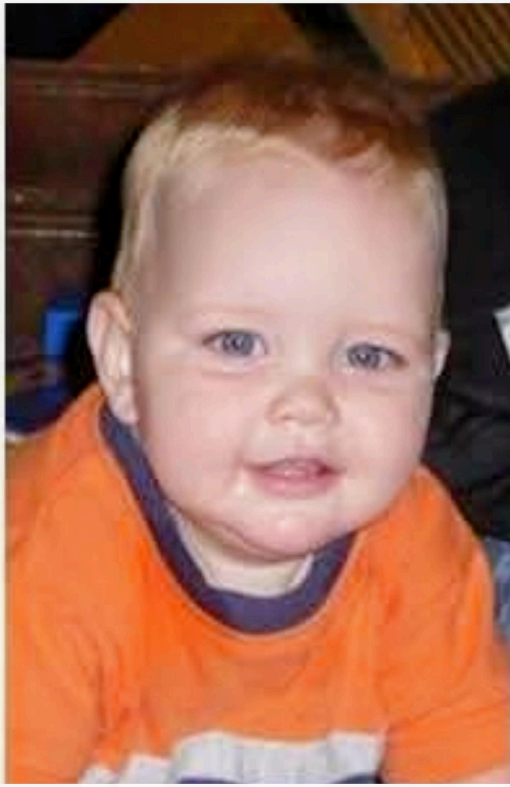
FORT BEND COUNTY

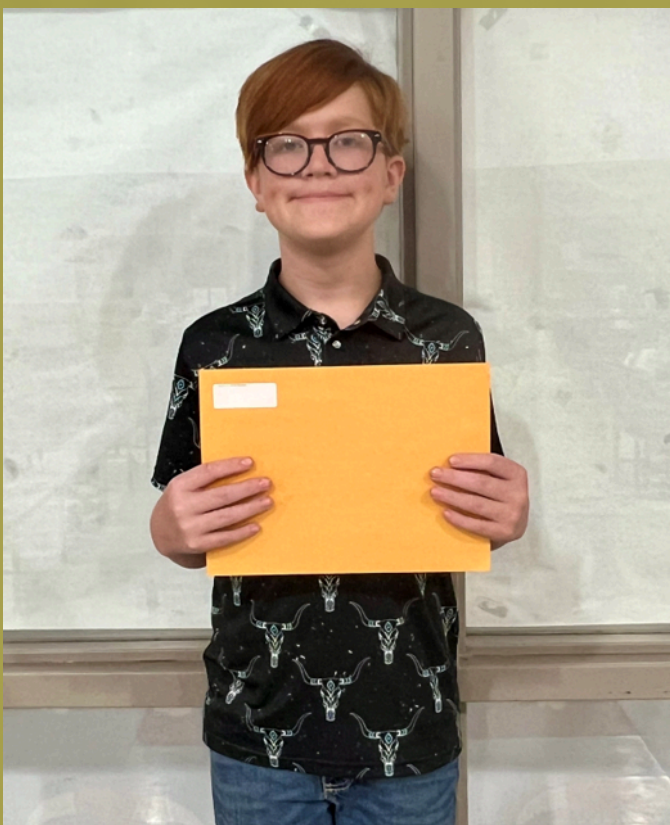
DALLAS COUNTY
